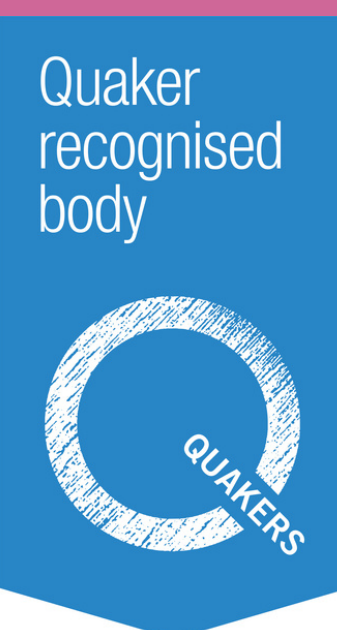




RJ Working: Next Steps

Our work in the community is reliant on resources and funding and we're grateful for support that champions young people's teamwork and leadership



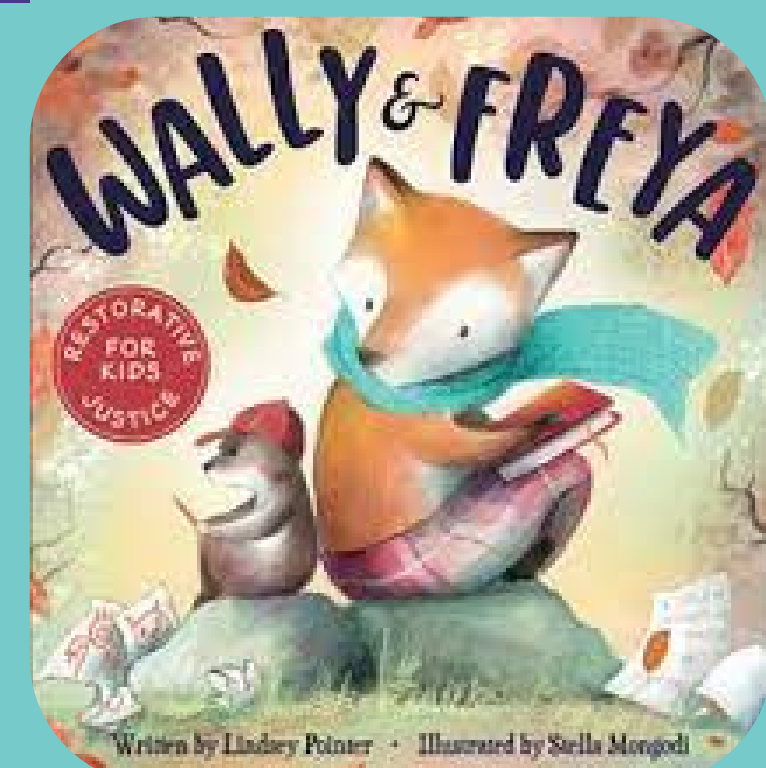
Young People in the Lead

Restorative Approaches to Nature, Environment & Climate
